SOCIAL SCIENCE: "The Antikythera Discovery" is an original work of nonfiction.

It was a stormy day as Captain Dimitrios Kondos sailed home to Greece from a sponge-diving expedition in North Africa in October 1900. So, he decided to wait out the weather near the tiny island of Antikythera, northwest of Crete. Seizing the opportunity to harvest more sponges, the captain sent his crew down to the sea floor to search. That is when diver Elias Stadiatos made an astonishing discovery: the remnants of a Roman ship that had sunk at least 2,000 years earlier, still containing statues, coins, jewelry, and other items stolen from the Greeks.

For the next year, aided by the Greek Navy, divers wearing unwieldy metal suits brought up a variety of furniture, weapons, and other artifacts from the wreck. The trove included an oddly shaped lump about the size of a shoebox that sat in a museum in Athens for months before anyone examined it. That lump turned out to be the most significant treasure of all. Now called the Antikythera Mechanism, it is a bronze clocklike device with an intricate system of gears and dials as well as astronomical inscriptions on its case. What was it used for? No one at the time could say. Over the next century, as technology became more advanced, researchers concluded that the mechanism was a complicated early "computer" designed to track the cycles of the solar

Facts

Facts are statements that can be proven true.

- Facts may be true or false.
- But facts can be proven.
- Example:

TJHSST offers about 15 senior research labs for rising 12th graders to choose from.

Opinions

Opinions are statements the author's feelings or point of view.

- Opinions can be argued.
- Opinions may be supported with facts.
- Example:

TJHSST is the best high school in the United States.

Reasoned Judgments

They are statements of the author's point of view that are supported by reason and evidence.

Example:

TJHSST is one of the best high schools in the USA because it offers its students different STEM courses and high tech labs that are unavailable to some other private and public high schools in the country. Students can get a well-rounded education when....

The highlighted statements are opinions. They reflect the author's feelings or views, and cannot be proved.

- Zoos aren't really good places for animals to be: The author may really believe this, but it is not something that can be proven beyond a doubt. This statement could be turned into a reasoned judgment if the author argued the point and provided reasons and evidence to support it.
- These programs are very entertaining and very fun: This also expresses the author's feelings. He or she may really enjoy the programs, but that does not make this statement a fact. And without dedicated supporting evidence, this is not a reasoned judgment.

Rationale

The highlighted statements are reasoned judgments. They reflect the author's perspective and are supported by evidence.

- With the destruction of its habitat, the destruction of the species cannot be far behind: The author has drawn the conclusion that without a home, the threat to the clouded leopard increases. This is supported by the evidence of the destruction of the cats' habitat and the shrinking numbers of the cats' population.
- Through their work, they ultimately will increase the populations of this species: The author believes the Clouded Leopard Project will be successful. This is supported by evidence of the cats that were born at the zoos and the efforts to protect the cats' habitat, thus giving them a safer place to live and breed.
